Mrs Staniforth's Year 8 have been learning about Hooke's Law in science. They have been learning about different forces and motion. One particular point of interest has been how changing the force affects the extension of a spring. Boing!

She could identify the different parts of a cell, including the cell wall and cell membranes. Well done to Cody and family, who won the Christmas hamper in the raffle! Thank you to everyone who joined us!


#### **Baguley Hall Primary School visit**


#### **Timetable**
