








Pride Month: June

Last week our amazing Year 7 student leadership team met to discuss how we can ensure protected characteristics are respected in school and what we could do to challenge this. This week Lexi S and Nirav S (Head Girl and Head Boy) along with Leba M (Student Prefect) were given the important job of launching a poster competition to their Year 7 peers. Nirav and Leba were incredibly brave and stood in front of their peers and Year group staff to remind us all about what protected characteristics are and the process of challenging any prejudice



towards any of the protected characteristics. As a school we want to eradicate discrimination against protected characteristics and we are starting by raising awareness for LGBTQ+ hence the launch of the poster competition. The deadline for this competition is Friday 21st June.

The Year 8 Student Forum are planning two events to support and raise awareness of Pride Month: a video and a Pride Postcard Display. Students are being encouraged to write a Pride Postcard or writing a poem on this them. The Pride postcards are being designed by Year 8 students and will be used to create a Pride display, sharing contributed anecdotes/poems. We have suggested their contributions could include: attending an organised event, making new friends or developing an understanding of Pride.



History visit: Year 10

As part of their History GCSE course, Year 10 students went on a visit to Quarry Bank Mill this week.

Quarry Bank Mill is a cotton mill in Styal, steeped in history. Students were able to learn about life working in a cotton mill, experience the machinery in action and felt the floor shake under their feet as the spinning and weaving took place. Set in some picturesque garden, it shows a juxtaposition of life experienced by owners and workers who lived side-by-side in times gone by.



The students found the visit very enjoyable and enjoyed learning about new and interesting things and were great ambassadors for the academy as they behaved respectfully to all throughout the trip.
