Homework System Changes

All students complete Read Cover Write Check based on content from their Knowledge Organiser each day. This is handed into their advisor and marked on our system. From Monday, November 25th, any student who does not complete this homework will receive a same-day 20-minute correction. Like all other positive and negative behaviours logged during the school day, this will be visible to you on the MCAS app.


Completing homework is an integral part of learning. It stops the forgetting curve, helping students remember more for longer. It is also a fundamental learning habit and links in with our value of Work Hard and our driver of Mastery.

To support both you as families and your child, I will be doing the following:

- Organising a Family Forum next week at 8.45-9.15, in which you are invited to discuss homework and receive support for helping your child.
