5 students from Dixons Brooklands Academy who attend Manchester United Foundation (MUF) Street Reds sessions in the evening, took part in the annual Premier League Kicks MU Foundation tournament recently.

MUF Street Reds is a community session for 8-19 years olds to play football for free, in partnership with Dixons Brooklands Academy, providing opportunities for the young people in our community to access sport and physical activity.

Premier League Kicks is the national initiative of the Premier League to fund community clubs across the country to engage with young people and provide opportunities to play and learn through volunteering or workshops about local issues they face in their communities. Each year they deliver the national PL Kicks Cup where representatives from each club come to play for the recognition of being national PL Kicks champions.

We are delighted that the students from Dixons Brooklands Academy won the MUF tournament and will go on to represent Manchester United at the national tournament for the third year in a row! Good luck to the students and we look forward to hearing about their experience in the coming months.
